How do I get a Library card?

You must have photo ID, proof of your current address (piece of mail, bill, etc.), and some way for us to contact you (phone, e-mail). Minors need a parent or legal guardian present to get a card.

Parents and guardians are financially responsible for their child's card.

Loan Policy

For the first month, New Patrons may only check out a maximum of 3 items at a time, one of which may be a DVD.

After the probationary period, a maximum of 50 items may be checked out, 7 of which can be DVDs and 2 DVD series for a total of 9.
